Applications for Freshman Elected Positions for 2019-2020 **must** meet the following eligibility requirements**:

- GPA of 2.0 or higher on most recent progress report or semester report card
- A record of good attendance and citizenship

If, for some reason, it is decided that you are not eligible to run, you will be notified.

Applicants for Freshman Elected Positions for 2019-2020 **must** also meet the following commitments or risk being removed from the election process:

Monday, August 19th:

- ❑ **Application Form – turn in to the Student Activities Office (P-106) by 4:00 PM**
- ❑ **Emailed Digital photo of yourself (headshot, please).** Email picture to Mrs. Hall at lhall@pausd.org as a .jpg attachment *before 11:59 PM*
- ❑ **Emailed 100-Word Statement - Why do you want to lead/ represent your class and what do you plan to do?** Email to Mrs. Hall at lhall@pausd.org *before 11:59 PM* as a word document attachment. Make sure your name and position in the subject line of your email.
- ❑ Check your email, read the information Mrs. Hall sends you and be prepared to ask questions at the Candidate Meeting

Tuesday, August 20th

- ❑ Attend the Freshman Candidate Meeting at Lunch in Student Activities Center (P-105).

Tuesday, August 20th and Wednesday, August 21st

- ❑ Film Candidate Video with SEC (will be scheduled at lunch meeting).

Thursday, August 22nd – Friday, August 23rd

- ❑ Participate in the Freshman Elections Assembly during SELF
- ❑ Campaign according to the Freshman Election Campaign Guidelines.

Other Commitments

- ❑ If elected, enrollment in C Period Student Government Class.

**** Minimum GPA/ School Attendance and Citizenship Requirements:** All ASB Officers are required to maintain a minimum GPA of 2.0 and have a record of good attendance and citizenship in order to be eligible for ASB office. If a student is elected for the 2019-2020 school year and has less than a 2.0 GPA at the end of the Fall semester or has attendance/ school behavior issues **he/she will be removed from office a replacement will be installed in accordance with ASB Constitutional Bylaws**

FRESHMAN ELECTED OFFICER JOB DESCRIPTIONS AND DUTIES

All positions include but are not limited to the following listed responsibilities

FRESHMAN CLASS PRESIDENT/ VICE-PRESIDENT: The Freshman Class President and Vice President is responsible for building the homecoming float, organizing fundraisers, and planning class events, running regular, lunchtime meetings with his/her class council, communicates regularly with class advisors and Mrs. Hall.

SITE COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVE: Attends monthly afternoon meetings of the Gunn Site Council and voices the student viewpoint regarding fund allocation. ***This is a 2-year position, although you will only be required to sit on SEC your Freshman year,*** and requires one meeting per month outside of the school day as well as an ability to interact with adults comfortably

The Class President, Class Vice President and Site Council Rep are also members of the Student Executive Council (SEC), which runs all student events at Gunn. Accordingly, successful candidates must enroll in the C period Student Government class, which has all the same requirements as other classes and will include assignments relating to leadership issues as well as individual roles on SEC, for which participants will receive a grade. If you're interested, note the following:

Responsibilities of SEC members include:

- Set up events such as dances and lunchtimes activities
- Help with school-wide events (Homecoming, International Week, Spring Fling, etc.) by running games, decorating, cleaning up, and any other assigned tasks.
- Dress up for all dress-up days.
- Represent their class and the Student Body as a whole
- Attend class to discuss issues relating to school climate and policy
- Participate in and complete all class assignments
- Make posters and help with publicity
- Work well with your peers and try to improve Gunn
- Be prepared for weekend and evening commitments as well as times when regular class periods will be missed to assist with SEC responsibilities.

Not sure you want to run, but want to get involved? Here's some info about...

FRESHMAN CLASS COUNCIL (does not sit on SEC): Council members are responsible for building the homecoming float, organizing fundraisers, and planning class events. If selected, you will attend regular lunchtime council meetings with your officers and class advisors, and participate in all class events and fundraisers. The class council will be recruited at the first all class meeting after the election.

Gunn HS Freshman Class Elections - Campaigning Rules: 2019

- Campaign Timeline:** You are only allowed to campaign **on campus** during the week of elections on the following days: (Thursday, August 22nd – Friday, August 23rd). Online Campaigning, including but not limited to the creation of Facebook Groups and Events, YouTube videos, or other online/ social media **may not begin until Tuesday, August 20th** after the Candidate Meeting.
- Filming/ Taking Campaign Photos:** You are allowed to film or take campaign pictures on campus before Elections week, **not** during school hours. Any footage taken on campus can include yourself, but no other people.
- Endorsements:** Endorsements for individual candidates on public social media platforms or other public forums/ websites that represent groups or public figures **are not allowed** unless all candidates running for the same office are equally represented. If you are endorsed in this way it is your responsibility to request removal of the endorsement from the site administrator immediately or risk removals from the election.
- POSTERS/FLYERS:** You may post up to three (3) 22" by 28" posters (standard poster board size) on campus in designated areas. You may also combine the posters to make one large poster that does not exceed dimensions of 66" Wide x 84" Long (three standard 22" x 28" posters taped together). Alternatively, you may use six (6) 8" by 11" flyers to replace a poster, with a grand total of eighteen (18) flyers possible (assuming you make NO posters).
 - **The posters/flyers cannot be posted until 7:30 AM on Thursday, August 22nd.** Mrs. Hall will remove any posters that are put up before this time. Do not overlap other posters. SEC will provide paper and paints for you to use free of charge, if you so choose—these items will not count towards your campaign expenditures. All poster/flyer designs must be pre-approved by Mrs. Hall and stamped before being posted on campus.
 - **Posters/flyers may be posted in the following areas using only blue tape:** Little Theater wall, bathroom walls and doors, campus pillars, the walls of hallways and buildings, N-Building bannister. Flyers may not be posted on the front of Spangenberg Theater, on windows or in classrooms without express permission of the faculty member associated with the room.
 - The SAO can provide butcher paper and paints for you to use if you would like to use those supplies.
- HAND HELD SIGNS:** You may carry a sign that is no larger than 24" x 24" wide.
- Expectations of Behavior:** Candidates shall not put down any other candidate. Candidates shall not use obscene, racial, discriminatory, or any other controversial items/ wording in any aspect of their campaign.
- Campaign Handout and Materials:** Candidates may only use their wall posters, approved handouts, the Oracle Election Coverage and hand-held signs to promote themselves on campus. Clear your items with Mrs. Hall by the Friday before Elections Week. Use of handouts that are not approved will result in immediate disqualification.
 - The following handouts are prohibited and will result in disqualification from the election: 1) Food or candy handouts of any kind, 2) Confetti or Paper Flyers, 3) Toys that may cause a disruption in classrooms, 4) Anything with adhesive (with the exception of Post-It notes.).
 - You may "decorate" yourself as part of your campaign, which may include wearing decorated clothing or things that designate YOU as the candidate for your office. You may decorate yourself beginning Thursday, 8/22.
 - Candidates may not use any type of amplified sound system as part of their personal campaign.
- Running Mates:** Candidates are not allowed to have running-mates.
- Campaign Spending:** Candidates may spend no more than \$35.00 on campaigning supplies and handouts (including signs, posters, self-decorating, and shirts/decorations for supporters). Any overspending will result in disqualification. Candidates are expected to complete and submit a Financial Disclosure Form and attach all receipts of money spent. The cost of some items used for campaign that were already owned must also be factored in to the candidate's \$35.00 total spending. See Financial Disclosure Form for details.
- Voting:** Elections will take place on <https://www.tallyspace.com/vote/GunnASB> on Thursday August 22nd after SELF through Friday August 23rd at 3:40pm. All qualified voters will have time during science classes to vote in addition to online voting, which will be open 24 hours.
- Run-Off Elections:** If there are four or more student candidates in an election for a single position, there will be a runoff election between the two highest vote-getters to determine the winner of the election, **unless** one candidate gathers a majority (50% +) of the vote in the initial election, or the candidate with the most votes in the initial election exceeds the next highest vote-getter by over 10 percentage points of the total vote
- Announcement of Results:** On Friday the campus must be clean of all election materials before election results are announced. Provided that the campus is cleaned to the approval of SEC and Mrs. Hall, results will be posted at the SAC, online on Schoology, the Student Activities Election Website (www.gunnsec.org) and SEC Social Media.
